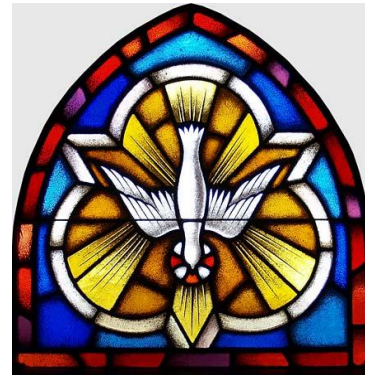
IMPORTANT CONFIRMATION REMINDERS FOR LEVEL 7

SOLEMNITY OF ALL SAINTS

HEARING THE WORD:

MATTHEW 5:1 -12a

When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain, and after he had sat down, his disciples came to him. He began to teach them, saying: /"Blessed are the poor in spirit, / for theirs is the Kingdom of heaven. / Blessed are they who mourn, / for they will be comforted. / Blessed are the meek, / for they will inherit the land. / Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, / for they will be satisfied. / Blessed are the merciful, / for they will be shown mercy. / Blessed are the clean of heart, / for they will see God. / Blessed are the peacemakers, / for they will be called children of God. / Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, / for theirs is the Kingdom of heaven. / Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you / and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me. / Rejoice and be glad, / for your reward will be great in heaven."

REFLECTING ON THE WORD

It might be hard to find the Beatitudes as a reason to rejoice. Some may even think that Jesus can keep his reward if recipients first need to mourn or be persecuted. Jesus may be asking us to look again at the hard things in life. Can there be joy in mourning, hunger and persecution? Do we have the ability to return to God's love repeatedly and live out of that love, while still recognizing the pain and suffering that we endure as part of being on earth?
