Holy Trinity PREP is continuing to accept registration forms for the 2018-2019 school year. Two weeks ago all students in Levels Kindergarten through 6 and Special Sacraments took home registration forms and tuition letters for next year. Each student who is returning next year needs to reregister. This is necessary so that we can plan our classes and catechists for next year.

Tuition for one child - \$85.00. **If paid by March 7, 2018 - \$75.00**

Two or more children - \$125.00. **If paid by March 7, 2018 - \$105.00**

All registration forms and tuition must be returned by April 18, 2018 to avoid a \$10.00 late fee.

Please **do not wait until after Mass to collect your soup kettle.** In order for this activity to count


towards your Confirmation Service Project you must be at Mass-signing up does not mean you have completed the service opportunity.



FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

HEARING THE WORD

MARK 1: 29 – 39

On leaving the synagogue Jesus entered the house of Simon and Andrew with James and John. Simon's mother-in-law lay sick with a fever. They immediately told him about her. He approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up. Then the fever left her and she waited on them.

When it was evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were ill or possessed by demons. The whole town was gathered at the door. He cured many who were sick with various diseases, and he drove out many demons, not permitting them to speak because they knew him.

Rising very early before dawn, he left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed. Simon and those who were with him pursued him and on finding him said, "Everyone is looking for you." He told them, "Let us go on to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose have I come." So he went into their synagogues, preaching and driving out demons throughout the whole of Galilee.

REFLECTING ON THE WORD

"For this purpose have I come," Jesus said. Jesus preached and healed. He did not build anything, or rule, or invent anything. Through his preaching and healing, other things were set into place. People who have been healed and have heard the Good News no longer live in fear or want. Communities who have heard the Gospel will come together to take care of each other's needs. We must have confidence in the good that flows from faith.
